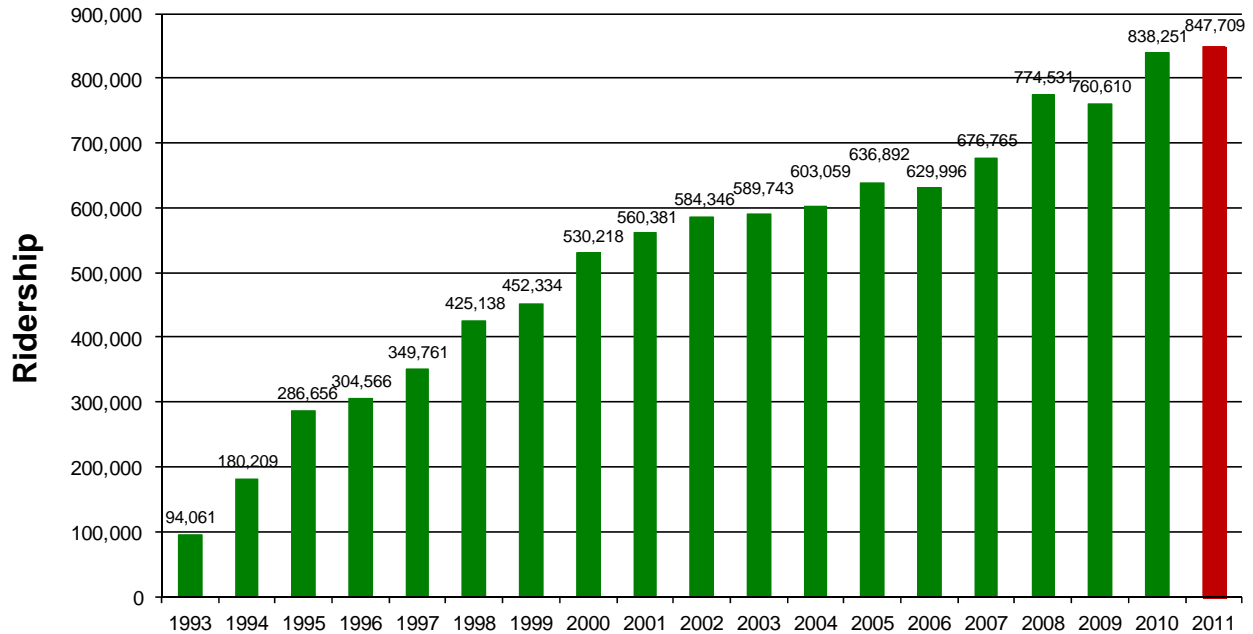


## Amtrak Cascades Annual Ridership Report – 2011

### Ridership – Record Ridership



- The total annual ridership for 2011 exceeded 2010 annual ridership by 9,458 and exceeded 2009 ridership by 87,099. This is a record annual ridership for Amtrak Cascades service.
